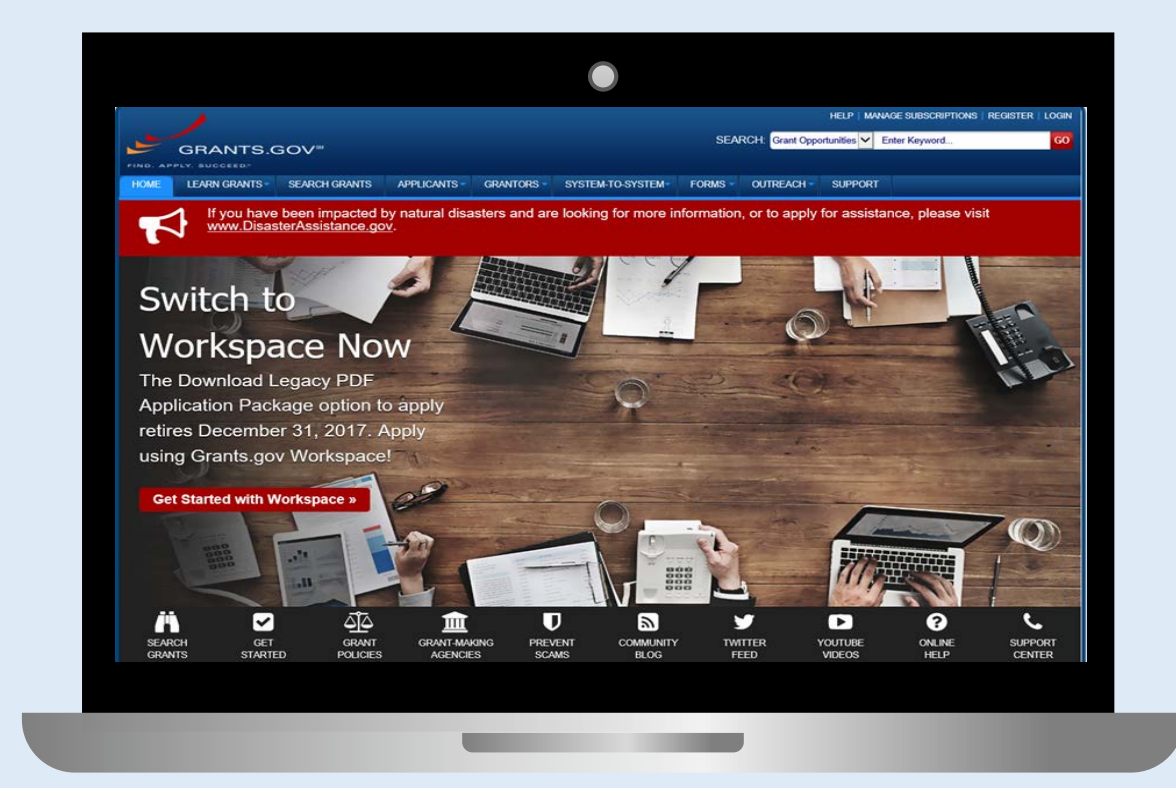


# The Grant Application Process for FEDERAL FUNDING

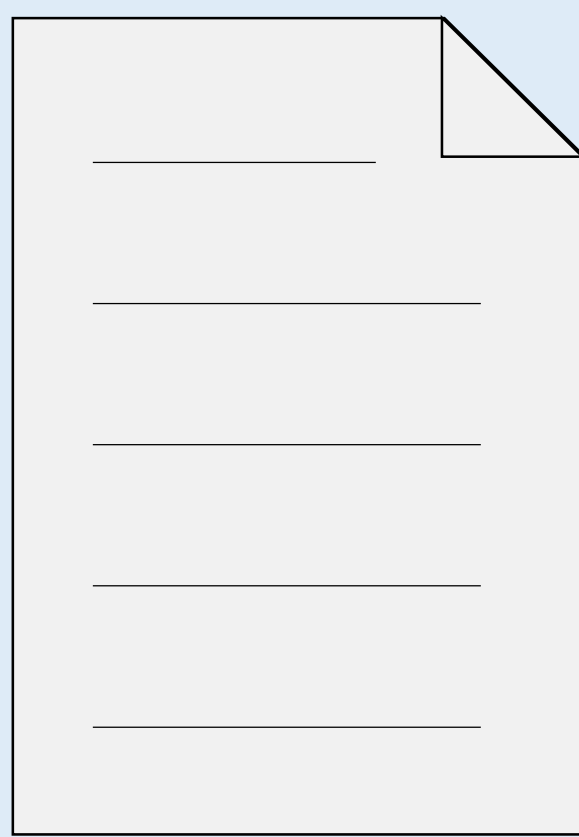


## GRANTOR

Grantor establishes grant opportunity, funding criteria, & Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)

Grantor creates application package on Grants.gov for specific grant opportunity

Application package published on Grants.gov



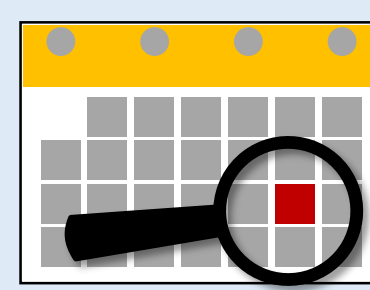
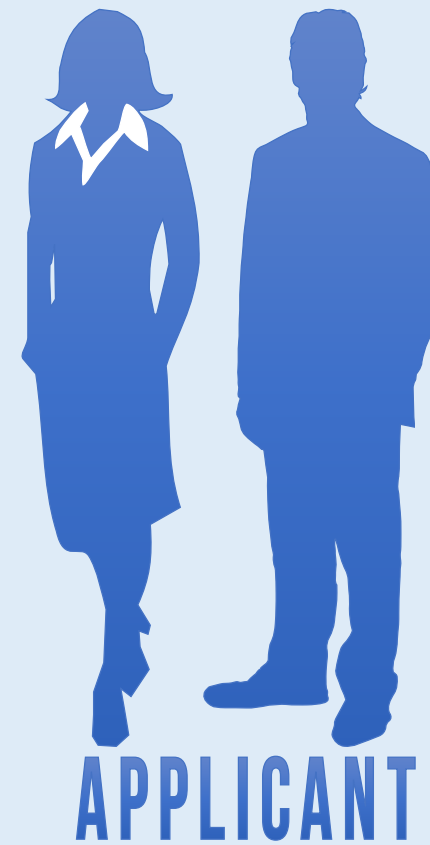
Application package is one of many in searchable database on Grants.gov

## APPLICANT

Applicant searches Grants.gov for applicable funding opportunities

Applicant registers on Grants.gov and downloads the grant application

Applicant submits the completed grant application via Grants.gov before deadline (usually within 60-90 days)



Don't miss the deadline!

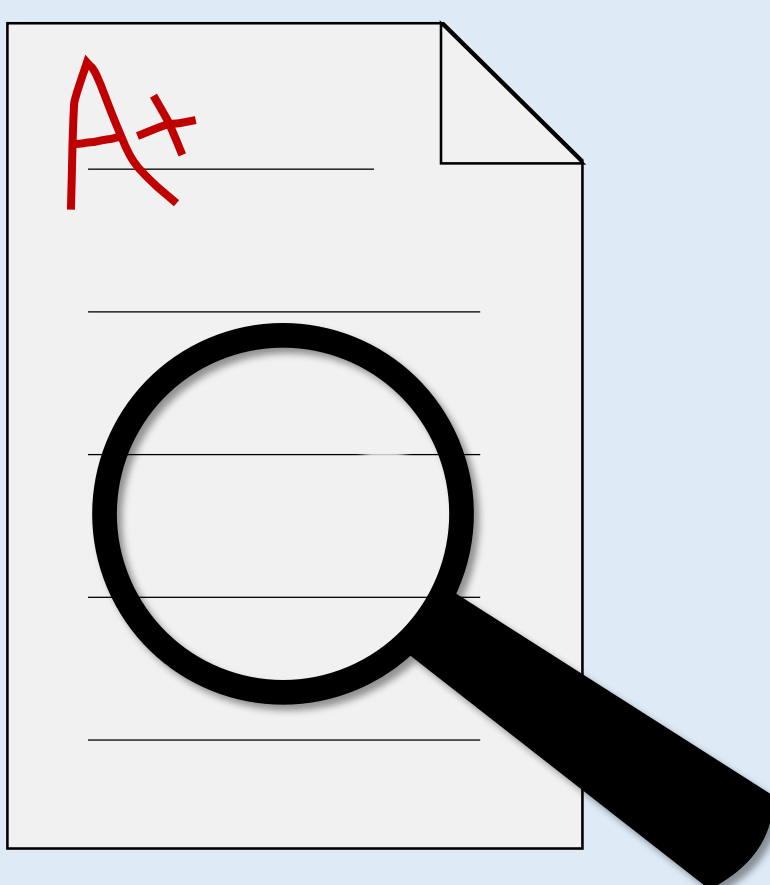
Grants.gov inspects application package for errors & transmits to Grantor

## GRANTOR

Grantor sends applications to Division of Independent Review, a committee of independent experts related to field

Committee reviews and scores grant application based on criteria listed in NOFO (30-90 day process)

Grantor selects & notifies Applicant of grant award

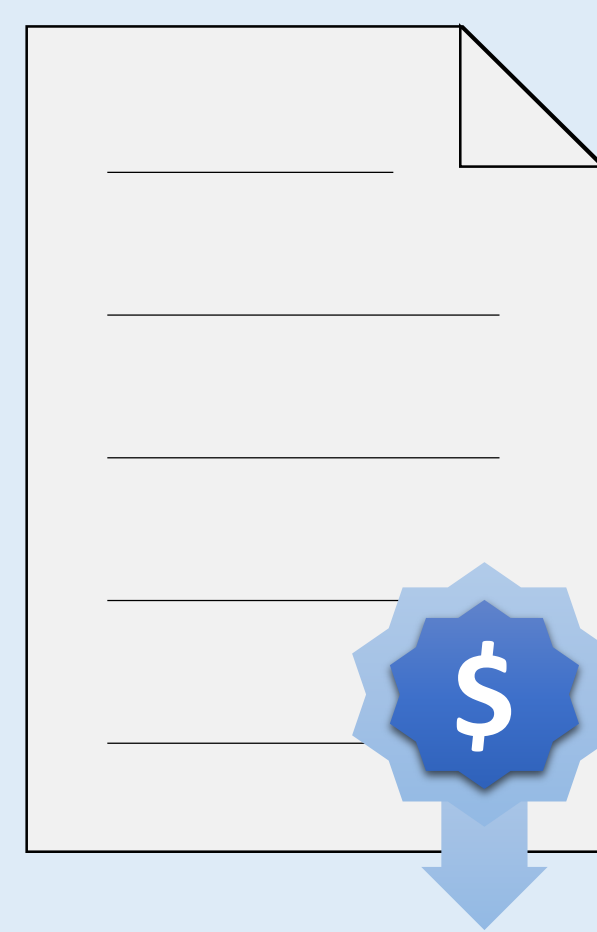


## APPLICANT

If grant accepted, Applicant receives a Notice of Award (NOA) letter from Grantor

Applicant ensures that all relevant personnel within organization receive a copy of the NOA

Applicant works on the priorities outlined in the grant work plan section
